To the Anglican Church Women of the Diocese of Saskatchewan:

Just as winter makes spring possible, so also, does spring give rise to summer and summer must be over for autumn to bring winter's rest to the earth. The Church has wisely designed that the life of faith be molded by our submission to the seasons. The Daily, Weekly, Seasonal, and Yearly work of the Church's Cycle of Prayer in conjunction with the Services and Liturgies, Observances, and Rites are designed to bring us into God's presence trough the cycles of our worship.

May the scarcity of the Season of Lent, through the pain of the Season of Passiontide, lead us into the joy of the season of Eastertide, bless you this year and for ever.
